Mayor Hanics called the Meeting of the Common Council of the Borough of Alpha to order at 7:00 p.m. on Tuesday, April 12, 2011.

Mayor Hanics announced that adequate notice of the meeting was given to the Star Gazette and posted on the bulletin board in the Clerk's office satisfying the requirements of the Open Public Meeting Act:

NOTICE

Pursuant to the provisions of the Open Public Meetings Act, adequate notice of this meeting has been given. On January 5, 2011, the Municipal Clerk delivered to the Star Gazette and posted on the bulletin board in the Municipal Clerk's office a notice containing the date, time, and place of this meeting of the Borough Council. Also said notice has been mailed to persons requesting the same.

Mayor Hanics led prayer and the salute to the flag.

Roll Call: Present; Councilman Dunwell, Councilman Gara, Councilman Pfefferle, Councilman Savary, Councilwoman Tarsi and Councilman Zikas. Also present Borough Attorney, Christopher Troxell, Borough Clerk, Laurie A. Barton and CFO, Lorraine Rossetti.

Public Comment:

Charles Bodogh of 117 East Central Avenue discussed his concerns regarding the water leaks in the Borough.

Ron Hart of 25 Industrial Drive discussed his opinions on having an asphalt plant in the Borough.

Lou Cartabona of 1119 Fifth Avenue discussed his opinions regarding raising taxes in the Borough.

Dave Cavanaugh of 1153 Sixth Avenue discussed his opinions about the salaries and taxes in the Borough with regards to the budget.

Lloyd Best of 1000 Dewey Avenue discussed his opinions regarding the duties of the Public Works Department.

Billy Daniels of Industrial Drive expressed opposition to the asphalt plant in the Borough due to the effects the dust might have on the solar farm nearby.

Dave Cavanaugh of 1153 Sixth Avenue asked about a parking ordinance in the Borough.

Mrs. Barton gave the bids to the Borough Attorney for review.

Ordinances:

Councilwoman Tarsi made a motion to open the public hearing for the second reading of the following ordinance:

ORDINANCE 2011-03 (Second Reading) BOROUGH OF ALPHA ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF ALPHA AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING CODE SECTION 410.20 I INDUSTRIAL ZONE

WHEREAS, the Council of the Borough of Alpha desires to amend a portion of Chapter 410, Zoning, specifically Section 410-20 C. and amend its Code accordingly;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the Borough of Alpha in the County of Warren and State of New Jersey that "Section 410-20, I Industrial Zone, subsection C." be amended and supplemented as follows:

C. Prohibited uses.

- (1) The development, production, storage, deployment, usage or fabrication of radioactive materials. This prohibition shall not apply to naturally occurring material containing low, normal or background levels of radiation nor to the production of consumer products in general use, including products such as smoke detectors and time pieces, nor to commonly accepted medical uses such as x-rays and pharmaceutical.
- (2) Non-municipal outdoor vehicle, leaf and sludge recycling, treatment, conversion or composting of any type.
- (3) Recycling facilities such as vehicle recycling or junkyards, wood pallet recycling, incinerators, landfills, resource recovery facilities or the storage and/or transfer of hazardous or toxic fuel or waste of any kind.

(4) The manufacturing, processing, and/or storage of concrete and/or bituminous concrete.

Councilman Dunwell seconded the motion.

Dave Degaralamo, on behalf of Intercounty Paving, discussed an application that went before the Land Use Board for a property on Edge Road. Mr. Degaralamo also discussed details regarding the effect this ordinance has on the application for the asphalt plant. He requested that Mayor and Council reject the ordinance in light of various factors he highlighted in this discussion.

Ron Hart of 25 Industrial Drive discussed his opinions regarding how the asphalt plant would effect the area.

Norma Smith of 168 Seventh Avenue discussed her opinion regarding the asphalt plant and stated she does not want this plant behind her house.

Michael with Fenkin Consruction gave a description of his history with the Borough and expressed his disapproval of the ordinance because of how it could effect the asphalt plant application.

Lou Cartabona of 1119 Fifth Avenue discussed his understanding of the ordinance and stated he is in support of Mayor and Council regarding the ordinance.

Attorneys representing Intercounty Paving were present and addressed questions from Council. Lengthy discussions ensued.

Mayor Hanics reminded the date and time of the upcoming Land Use Board meeting will be Wednesday, April 20th, 2011 at 7:30pm.

Ron Hart of 25 Industrial Drive asked for clarification regarding details of this ordinance.

Lloyd Best of 1000 Dewey Avenue discussed his opinions regarding this ordinance. He stated he is against anything that is going to raise the taxes for residents in the Borough, making reference to school and water issues.

Lou Cartabona of 1119 Fifth Avenue discussed his understanding of this ordinance pertaining to Mr. Best's concerns.

Billy Daniels of Industrial Drive discussed his opinion regarding this ordinance.

Charles Bodogh of 117 East Central Avenue discussed his opinons with regard to this ordinance.

Mr. Cavanaugh asked about the hours of the proposed asphalt plant and was referred to the upcoming Land Use Board meeting.

Councilwoman Tarsi made a motion to close the public hearing. Councilman Gara seconded the motion. Councilman Savary asked if a ten minute executive session would be appropriate to discuss matters before voting and Attorney Troxell advised the discussion remain public.

Councilman Pfefferle made a motion to adopt the ordinance. Councilman Dunwell seconded the motion. Councilman Savary requested to vote last. Discussions ensued. Roll call; Ayes; Councilman Dunwell, Councilman Pfefferle, and Councilman Savary. Nays; Councilman Gara, Councilman Zikas, and Councilwoman Tarsi. Mayor Hanics voted nay, breaking the tie, and the ordinance failed.

Mayor Hanics and Councilman Gara gave explanations regarding the reasons why the voted "nay" on this ordinance. Discussions ensued.

Councilwoman Tarsi made a motion to introduce the following ordinance for first reading:

ORDINANCE 2011-04

BOND ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING IMPROVEMENTS TO WATER INFRASTRUCTURE AND APPROPRIATING \$100,000.00 THEREFORE AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$85,000.00 BONDS OR NOTES TO FINANCE PART OF THE COST THEREOF.

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Borough Council of the Borough of Alpha, in the County of Warren, New Jersey (not less than two-thirds of all members thereof affirmatively concurring) as follows:

SECTION 1:

The purchase described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance is hereby authorized to be undertaken by the Borough of Alpha, New Jersey (the "Borough"). For said improvement (the "Improvement") there is hereby appropriated the amount of \$15,000.00, which is now available by virtue of provision in one or more previously adopted budgets for down payment or capital improvements in the account Water/Sewer Capital Improvement Fund. Said appropriation shall serve as the down payment required by the Local Bond Law of the State of New Jersey, constituting Chapter 2 of Title 40A of the New Jersey Statutes, as amended and supplemented (the "Local Bond Law").

SECTION 2

In order to finance the additional cost of the Improvement not covered by the above appropriation, negotiable bonds of the Borough are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount not to exceed \$85,000.00 pursuant to the provisions of the Local Bond Law (the "Bonds"). In anticipation of the issuance of the Bonds and to temporarily finance said Improvement, negotiable bond anticipation notes of the Borough are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount not to exceed \$85,000.00 pursuant to the provisions of the Local Bond Law (the "Bond Anticipation Notes" or "Notes").

SECTION 3

- (a) The improvement authorized is entitled Water Infrastructure Improvements and includes but is not limited to the upgrading of machinery, equipment and facilities for the Water Utility.
 - (b) The estimated cost of the improvement is \$100,000.00.
 - (c) The estimated maximum amount of bonds to be issued is not to exceed \$85,000.00
 - (d) The period of usefulness is, in accordance with N.J.S.A.40A:2-22a.2. 15 years.

SECTION 4

All Bond Anticipation Notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as may be determined by the Certified Finance Officer of the Borough (the "CFO"); provided that no Note shall mature later than one year from its date.

The Notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and be in such form as may be determined by the CFO.

The CFO shall determine all matters in connection with Notes issued pursuant to this ordinance, and the signature of the CFO upon the Notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. All Notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the provisions of Section 8(a) of the Local Bond Law. The CFO is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the Notes from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver them to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the date of delivery thereof. The CFO is directed to report in writing to the Borough Council of the Borough at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of the Notes pursuant to this ordinance is made.

Such report must include the amount, the description, the interest rate, the maturity schedule of the Notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

SECTION 5:

The capital budget of the Borough is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. The resolution in the form promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director, Division of Local Government Services, Departments of Community Affairs, State of New Jersey is on file with the Municipal Clerk and is available for public inspection.

SECTION 6:

The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared, recited and stated:

- (a) The improvement described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance is not current expenses, and is a capital improvement that the Borough may lawfully make as a general improvement, and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specifically assessed on property specially benefited thereby.
- (b) An aggregate amount not exceeding \$10,000.00 for items of expense listed in and permitted under Section 20 of the Local Bond Law is included in the estimate cost of the Improvements, as indicated herein.

SECTION 7:

Any funds received from time to time by the Borough as contributions in aid of financing the purpose described in Section 3 of this Ordinance shall be used for financing said Improvements by application thereof either to direct payment of the cost of said Improvements or to the payment or reduction of the authorization of the obligations of the Borough authorized thereof by this Bond Ordinance. Any such funds received may, and all such funds so received which are not required for direct payment of the cost of said Improvements shall, be held and applied by the Borough as funds applicable only to the payment of obligations of the Borough authorized by this Bond Ordinance.

SECTION 8:

The full faith and credit of the Borough are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on the obligations authorized by this Bond Ordinance.

The obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the Borough, and the Borough shall be obligated to levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable property within the Borough for the payment of the obligations and the interest thereon without limitation of rate or amount in addition to user fees for water and sewer consumers.

SECTION 9:

This Bond Ordinance constitutes a declaration of official intent under Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-2. The Borough reasonable expects to pay expenditures with respect to the Improvements prior to the date the Borough incurs debt obligations under this Bond Ordinance. The Borough reasonably expects to reimburse expenditures with the proceeds of debt to be incurred by the Borough under this Bond Ordinance. The maximum principal amount of debt expected to be issued for payment of the costs of the Improvements is \$85,000.00.

This Bond Ordinance shall take effect 20 days after the first publication thereof after the

final adoption, as provided by the Local Bond Law.

Councilman Gara seconded the motion. CFO, Lorraine Rosetti gave a brief

explanation of this ordinance. The public hearing date for this ordinance will be April 26,

2011. Discussions ensued. Original version of introduced ordinance was rescinded. Roll

call; Ayes; Councilman Dunwell, Councilman Gara, Councilman Pfefferle, Councilman

Savary, Councilwoman Tarsi and Councilman Zikas. Nays; none.

Councilwoman Tarsi made a motion to introduce the ammended version of the

ordinance. Councilman Gara seconded the motion. Roll call; Ayes; Councilman Dunwell,

Councilman Gara, Councilman Pfefferle, Councilman Savary, Councilwoman Tarsi and

Councilman Zikas. Nays; none. The public hearing date for this ordinance will be April

26th, 2011.

Resolutions: None.

Approval of Minutes: None.

Department Reports:

Administration, Councilman Craig Dunwell: Councilman Dunwell discussed

updates for the website and asked that any needed updates be submitted by next week to

him at: csdunwell@yahoo.com. Councilman Dunwell discussed details regarding Best

Practices and Open Space. He requested forty minutes in executive session for

contractual and personnel. In closing, Councilman Dunwell approved all bills, salaries,

and wages for his department.

Finance, Councilman Chris Pfefferle: Councilman Pfefferle discussed the search

for new banking services, stating there has been a delay due to new laws. It was

determined that the Mayor can vote in the event of a tie on any budget. He requested ten

minutes in executive session for personnel. In closing, Councilman Pfefferle approved

all bills, salaries and wages for his department.

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Health & Welfare, Councilman Alex Zikas: Councilman Zikas read the health report and gave an update regarding the town-wide clean up. Wild animals in the Borough were discussed. In closing, Councilman Zikas approved all bills, salaries and wages for his department.

Chipping and street sweeping was discussed. Conditions in the DPW garage were discussed. Councilman Dunwell requested an update regarding a plan for the installation of the water meters. A report will be given at the next council meeting. Discussions ensued.

100th Anniversary: Councilwoman Tarsi announced a 100th Anniversary Committee Meeting this Thursday March 31st, 2011 at 8 P.M. Councilwoman Tarsi asked that only three council members attend in order to avoid advertising costs.

Professionals and Officials Reports:

Mayor, Edward Hanics: Mayor Hanics discussed various letters he received and handed them over to the appropriate department(s), including a letter of request from Alpha PTO to hold the town wide yard sale on June 4th and 5th, 2011 from 8am to 3pm. Councilwoman Tarsi made a motion to approve this request. Councilman Dunwell seconded. All were in favor.

Councilwoman Tarsi made a motion to appoint Tim Mellert as an alternate member on the Land Use Board to replace Jeremy Beviss, who will be on a medical leave. Councilman Pfefferle seconded the motion. *Roll call;* Ayes; Councilman Gara, Councilman Savary, Councilman Zikas, Councilman Dunwell, Councilman Pfefferle, and Councilwoman Tarsi. Nays; None.

Mayor Hanics requested twenty minutes in executive session for contractual and litigation. Councilman Savary inquired about a letter from St. Mary's Church regarding a purchase of a property. Discussions ensued.

Police, Chief Paul Hager: Chief Hager stated the public that the annual Easter Egg Hunt will be this Saturday at Pohatcong School at 11am, weather permitting. Chief Hager requested an email sign-up link be posted to the Borough website.
