Public Comment:

Ronald Hart from 25 Industrial Drive expressed he is upset regarding alleged false accusations made about him regarding his water usage by Councilman Savary. Lengthy heated discussions ensued.

Louis Cartabona of 1119 Fifth Avenue asked for an update regarding the pedestrian bridge that was discussed at the last council meeting. Discussions ensued.

Attorney Troxell presented information researched (from 1924) regarding ownership of the Lee Avenue pedestrian bridge indicating that the Borough of Alpha owns the bridge.

Mrs. Mason from 1220 East Boulevard complained about noise from coming from Pinstripes bar. Discussions ensued. Mrs. Mason asked about enforcement of keeping up lawn maintenance in the Borough and this was discussed.

Mr. Mason of 1220 East Boulevard asked for an update about the issuing of handicapped parking spaces in the Borough. Discussions ensued.

Dave Cavanaugh of 1183 Sixth Avenue asked various questions regarding the water system in the Borough. Discussions ensued. Mr. Cavanaugh asked about using grant monies for the walk ways as opposed to doing it themselves. Engineer, Stanley Schrek gave explanation of this matter.

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Fred Schindler, the new Licensed Water Operator introduced himself and made himself available to answer questions regarding the water system in the Borough. Mr. Schindler reassured that the levels in the water system are well under maximum contaminant levels allowed by the state. Discussions ensued and questions regarding the water system and testing were addressed.

Lloyd Best from 1000 Dewey Avenue discussed his opinions regarding the pedestrian bridge and switching to the radio control meter reading system. Mr. Best asked about branches out on curbs in the Borough, chipping, and the dump at Industrial Drive. Discussions ensued.

Lou Cartabona of 1119 Fifth Avenue asked about updates to the Borough website.

Craig Dunwell of 1159 Seventh Avenue discussed the meter reading system and items regarding the Lee Avenue pedestrian bridge. Discussions ensued. Mr. Dunwell inquired about various issues regarding the water system in the Borough. Lengthy discussions ensued.

Eugene Boyle of 720 West Central Avenue asked about the Licensed Water Operator position and other various items regarding the water system. Discussions ensued.

Dave Cavanaugh inquired about the Licensed Water Operator position. Discussions ensued.

Councilman Savary read the following statement and discussions ensued:

On Friday, October 22 at approximately 9:30 A.M. I was told that I could not be present for meeting with D.E.P. personnel, Stan Schreck, our new water operator, and the D.P.W. employees. I refused to leave and Police Chief Hager was called to remove me. I left. On Tuesday, October 26, I was also refused access to a meeting with D.E.P. personnel, Stan Schreck and D.P.W. Also present was council person Klara Tarsi. I was told that it was her department and not mine. Doesn't Health and Welfare Department include anything involving water quality? I am deeply appalled by this situation. I feel my rights as a boro official and all rights of the people who voted for me were violated. I am disappointed in the actions taken by the governing body. I've been asked by numerous residents in town with concerns about our water. I would like an answer to why I was not allowed to be present at these meeting with D.E.P. officials. I do not just want answers, but, I want the truth in this matter.

ORDINANCE 2010-11 AN ORDINANCE TO CREATE THE POSITION OF MUNICIPAL HOUSING LIAISON FOR THE PURPOSE OF ADMINISTERING THE BOROUGH OF ALPHA'S AFFORDABLE HOUSING PROGRAM PURSUANT TO THE FAIR HOUSING ACT

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the Borough of Alpha in the County of Warren and State of new Jersey that the following amendments be made to Chapter _____ of the Borough of Alpha.

SECTION 1 – PURPOSE.

The purpose of this article is to create the administrative mechanisms needed for the execution of the Borough of Alpha's responsibility to assist in the provision of affordable housing pursuant to the Fair Housing Act of 1985.

SECTION 2 – DEFINITIONS

As used in this article, the following terms shall have the meanings indicated:

MUNICIPAL HOUSING LIAISON- The employee charged by the governing body with the responsibility for the oversight and administration of the affordable housing program for the Borough of Alpha.

ADMINISTRATIVE AGENT- The entity responsible for administering the affordability controls of some or all units in the affordable housing program for the Borough of Alpha to ensure that the restricted units under administration are affirmatively marketed and sold or rented, as applicable, only to low-and moderate income households.

SECTION 3 – ESTABLISHMENT OF MUNICIPAL HOUSING LIASON POSITION AND COMPENSATION; POWERS AND DUTIES

- A. Establishment of the position of municipal housing liaison. There is hereby established the position of municipal housing liaison for the Borough of Alpha.
- B. Subject to the approval of the Council on Affordable Housing (COAH), the municipal housing liaison shall be appointed by the governing body and may be a full or part time municipal employee.
- C. The municipal housing liaison shall be responsible for the oversight and administration of the affordable housing program for the Borough of Alpha including the following responsibilities which may not be contracted out, exclusive of item 6 which may be contracted out:
 - 1. Serving as the Borough of Alpha's primary point of contact for all inquiries from the State, affordable housing providers, administrative agents, and interested households;
 - 2. Monitoring the status of all restricted units in the Borough of Alpha's Fair Share Plan;
 - 3. Compiling, verifying and submitting annual reports as required by COAH;

- 4. Coordinating meetings with affordable housing providers and administrative agents, as applicable;
- 5. Attending continuing education opportunities on affordability controls, compliance monitoring, and affirmative marketing as offered or approved by COAH;
- 6. If applicable, serving as the administrative agent for some or all of the restricted units in the Borough of Alpha as described in F. below.
- D. Subject to approval by COAH, the Borough of Alpha my contract with or authorize a consultant, authority, government or any agency charged by the governing body, which entity shall have the responsibility of administering the affordable housing program of the Borough of Alpha, except for those responsibilities which may not be contracted out pursuant to subsection C above. If the Borough of Alpha contracts with another entity to administer all or any part of the affordable housing program, including the affordability controls and affirmative marketing plan, the municipal housing liaison shall supervise all contracting administrative agent.
- E. Compensation. Compensation shall be fixed by the governing body at the time of the appointment of the municipal housing liaison.
- F. Administrative powers and duties assigned to the municipal housing liaison.
 - (1) Affirmative marketing
 - (a) Conducting an outreach process to insure affirmative marketing of affordable housing units in accordance with the affirmative marketing plan of the Borough of Alpha and the provisions of N.J.A.C. 5:80-26.15; and
 - (b) Providing counseling or contracting to provide counseling services to low and moderate income applicants on subjects such as budgeting, credit issues, mortgage qualification, rental lease requirements, and landlord/tenant law.
 - (2) Household Certification
 - (a) Soliciting, scheduling, conducting and following up on interviews with interested households;
 - (b) Conducting interviews and obtaining sufficient documentation of gross income and assets upon which to base a determination of income eligibility for a low-or moderate income unit;
 - (c) Providing written notification to each applicant as to the determination of eligibility or non-eligibility;
 - (d) Requiring that all certified applicants for restricted units execute a certificate substantially in the form, as applicable, of either the ownership or rental certificates set forth in Appendices J and K of N.J.A.C. 5:80-26.1 et seq.
 - (e) Creating and maintaining a referral list of eligible applicant households living in the housing region and eligible applicant households with members working in the housing region where the units are located; and

- (f) Employing the random selection process as provided in the affirmative marketing plan of the borough of Alpha when referring households for certification to affordable units.
- (3) Affordability Controls
- (a) Furnishing to attorneys or closing agents forms of deed restrictions and mortgages for recording at the time of conveyance of title of each restricted unit;
- (b) Creating and maintaining a file on each restricted unit for its control period, including the recorded deed with restrictions, recorded mortgage and note, as appropriate;
- (c) Ensuring that the removal of the deed restrictions and cancellation of the mortgage note are effectuated and properly filed with the appropriate county's register of deeds or county clerk's office after the termination of the affordability controls for each restricted unit;
- (d) Communicating with lenders regarding foreclosures; and
- (e) Ensuring the issuance of Continuing Certificates of Occupancy or certifications pursuant to N.J.A.C. 5:80-26.10.
- (4) Resale and rental
- (a) Instituting and maintaining an effective means of communicating information between owners and the administrative agent regarding the availability of restricted units for resale or rental; and
- (b) Instituting and maintaining an effective means of communicating information to low and moderate income households regarding the availability of restricted units for resale or re-rental.
- (5) Processing request from unit owners
- (a) Reviewing and approving requests from owners of restricted units who wish to take out home equity loans or refinance during the term of their ownership;
- (b) Reviewing and approving requests to increase sales prices from owners of restricted units who wish to make capital improvements to the units that would affect the selling price, such authorizations to be limited to those improvements resulting in additional bedrooms or bathrooms and the cost of central air conditioning systems; and
- (c) Processing requests and making determinations on requests by owners of restricted units for hardship waivers.
- (6) Enforcement
- (a) Securing annually lists of all affordable housing units for which tax bills are mailed to absentee owners and notifying all such owners that they must either move back to their unit or sell it;
- (b) Securing from all developers and sponsors of restricted units, at the earliest point of contact in the processing of the project or development, written acknowledgement of the requirement that no restricted unit can be offered, or in any other way committed, to

any person, other than a household duly certified to the unit by the administrative agent;

- (c) The posting annually in all rental properties, including two-family homes, of a notice as to the maximum permitted rent together with the telephone number of the administrative agent where complaints of excess rent can be made;
- (d) Sending annual mailings to all owners of affordable dwelling units reminding them of the notices and requirements outlined in N.J.A.C. 5:80-26.18(d) 4;
- (e) Establishing a program for diverting unlawful rent payments to the municipality's affordable housing trust fund or other appropriate municipal fund approved by the DCA;
- (f) Creating and publishing a written operating manual, as approved by COAH, setting forth procedures for administering such affordability controls; and
- (g) Providing annual reports to COAH as required.
- (7) The administrative agent shall have authority to take all actions necessary and appropriate to carry out its responsibilities hereunder.

SECTION 4 – SEVERABILITY

If any section, subjection paragraph, sentence or other part of this ordinance is adjudged unconstitutional or invalid, such judgment shall nota affect or invalidate the remainder of this ordinance but shall be confined in its effect to the section, subsection, paragraph, sentence or other part of this ordinance directly involved in the controversy in which said judgment shall have been rendered and all other provisions of this ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 5 - INCONSISTENT ORDINANCES REPEALED

All ordinances or parts of ordinances which are inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed, but only to the extent of such inconsistencies.

SECTION 6 – EFFECTIVE DATE

This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final adoption and publication in the manner prescribed by law.

Councilwoman Tarsi seconded the motion.

Laurie Cartabona of 1119 Fifth Avenue asked for an explanation regarding this position.

Councilman H. Zikas made a motion to close the public hearing. Councilwoman Tarsi seconded the motion.

Councilman H. Zikas made a motion to open the following ordinance for public hearing:

ORDINANCE 2010-12 AN ORDINANCE ENTITLED "AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOARD OF HEALTH, BOROUGH OF ALPHA, PROHIBITING THE FEEDING OF WILDLIFE AND/OR STRAY ANIMALS"

BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Health, Borough of Alpha, Warren County, New Jersey as follows:

<u>SECTION 1- PROHIBITED CONDUCT.</u> No person shall feed or attract in any public park or on any other property, public or private, any wild or stray animals which are not licensed to a resident of the Borough of Alpha and not under the control of any person. The definition of "wild or stray animals" shall include but not be limited to the following: dogs, cats, waterfowl, raccoons, skunks, groundhogs, pigeons and other birds. This Ordinance shall not apply to enclosed, elevated bird feeder devices or confined wildlife (for example, wildlife confined in zoos, parks or rehabilitation centers, or unconfirmed wildlife at environmental education centers). This prohibition shall also apply to any conditions by which the feeding of animals creates a public health risk or unsanitary conditions.

<u>SECTION II – ENFORCEMENT.</u> This Ordinance shall be enforced by the contracted police department, the Health Department, and/or other Municipal officials and/or designees of the Borough of Alpha.

Any person found to be in violation of this Ordinance shall be ordered to cease the feeding immediately.

<u>SECTION III – VIOLATIONS AND PENALTIES.</u> Any person(s) found to be in violation of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be subject to a fine of at least Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) but not to exceed the sum of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00).

Councilwoman Tarsi seconded the motion.

Louis Cartabona of 1119 Fifth Avenue expressed concern regarding this ordinance because he wants to feed wild birds. Discussions ensued and Attorney Troxell advised the public to use bird feeders if they would like to feed wild birds.

ORDINANCE 2010-13

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FUNDING FOR PURCHASE OF RF RADIO FREQUENCY READING REMOTES AND APPROPRIATING \$115,000 OF UTILITY CAPITAL FUND BALANCE FOR SUCH PURPOSE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOROUGH COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF ALPHA, IN THE COUNTY OF WARREN AND STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Borough of Alpha, in the County of Warren, in the State of New Jersey, authorizes the purchase of RF Radio Frequency Remote Units for the Borough of Alpha to be funded from the sources specified in Section 2 of the Ordinance.
