Norfolk has submitted a bill to the Borough. CFO, Lorraine Rossetti spoke with Shelley

McGregor and confirmed it is the cost of doing business with Norfolk Southern,

Councilman Dunwell reviewed the Engineers report that was distributed to Mayor and Council.

In closing, Councilman Dunwell approved bills, salaries and wages for his department with the exception of the Roto Rooter bill # 12-00376.

Discussions ensued regarding Penn Bower and work to be finished regarding sidewalks and patch work.

Professionals & Officials Report

Mayor, Edward Hanics: Mayor Hanics announced the Big Brothers and Sisters annual bowling to be held at Oakwood Lanes on April 13th. Mayor Hanics asked anyone who is interested to let him know.

Fire Department, Charles Bodogh: Mr. Bodogh announced the roast beef dinner to be held on the 20th, proceeds going towards the anniversary celebration.

Emergency Squad, Brad Fagan: Mr. Fagan reported that there are some street signs missing. Mr. Fagan reported that his brother Matthew is working with the NYPD at their academy for training. Councilman Cartabona reiterated the importance of street signs and also house numbers for the emergency squad to see when responding to calls.

OEM, Hunter Stagg: Mr. Stagg briefed Mayor and Council on various functions of his office and meetings with FEMA regarding Super Storm Sandy and damages.

Mr. Stagg reported that they are looking into having the school designated as a shelter.

Attorney, Christopher Troxell: Mr. Troxell cited the vacancy law with respect to attendance at council meetings. Mr. Troxell summarized that the law states if a member misses eight consecutive weeks and without being excused from attendance, can be removed from Council.
