# ORDINANCE 2013-4 BOND ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING IMPROVEMENTS TO SEWER INFRASTRUCTURE AND GENERAL SYSTEM IMPROVEMENTS AND APPROPRIATING \$900,000.00 THEREFORE AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$890,000.00 BONDS OR NOTES TO FINANCE PART OF THE COST THEREOF.

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Borough Council of the Borough of Alpha, in the County of Warren, New Jersey (not less than two-thirds of all members thereof affirmatively concurring) as follows:

#### SECTION 1:

The purchase described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance is hereby authorized to be undertaken by the Borough of Alpha, New Jersey (the "Borough"). For said improvement (the "Improvement") there is hereby appropriated the amount of \$900,000.00, of which \$10,000 is now available by virtue of provision in one or more previously adopted budgets for down payment or capital improvements in the account Water/Sewer Capital Improvement Fund. Said appropriation shall serve as the down payment though it is not required as a self liquidating utility by the Local Bond Law of the State of New Jersey, constituting Chapter 2 of Title 40A of the New Jersey Statutes, as amended and supplemented (the "Local Bond Law").

#### **SECTION 2**

In order to finance the additional cost of the Improvement not covered by the above appropriation, negotiable bonds of the Borough are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount not to exceed \$890,000.00 pursuant to the provisions of the Local Bond Law (the "Bonds"). In anticipation of the issuance of the Bonds and to temporarily finance said Improvement, negotiable bond anticipation notes of the Borough are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount not to exceed \$890,000.00 pursuant to the provisions of the Local Bond Law (the "Bond Anticipation Notes" or "Notes").

#### **SECTION 3**

(a) The improvement authorized is entitled Sewer Infrastructure Improvements/General Improvements and includes but is not limited to the upgrading of equipment and facilities for the Sewer Utility.

- (b) The estimated cost of the improvement is \$900,000.00.
- (c) The estimated maximum amount of bonds to be issued is not to exceed \$890,000.00
- (d)The period of usefulness is, in accordance with N.J.S.A.40A:2-22 is 20 years.

#### **SECTION 4**

All Bond Anticipation Notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as may be determined by the Certified Finance Officer of the Borough (the "CFO"); provided that no Note shall mature later than one year from its date.

The Notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and be in such form as may be determined by the CFO. The CFO shall determine all matters in connection with Notes issued pursuant to this ordinance, and the signature of the CFO upon the Notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. All Notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the provisions of Section 8(a) of the Local Bond Law. The CFO is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the Notes from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver them to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the date of delivery thereof. The CFO is directed to report in writing to the Borough Council of the Borough at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of the Notes pursuant to this ordinance is made.

Such report must include the amount, the description, the interest rate, the maturity schedule of the Notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

#### **SECTION 5:**

The capital budget of the Borough is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. The resolution in the form promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director, Division of Local Government Services, Departments of Community Affairs, State of New Jersey is on file with the Municipal Clerk and is available for public inspection.

#### SECTION 6:

The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared, recited and stated:

(a) The improvement described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance is not current expenses, and is a capital improvement that the Borough may lawfully make as a general improvement, and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specifically assessed on property specially benefited thereby.

(b) An aggregate amount not exceeding \$225,000.00 for items of expense listed in and permitted under Section 20 of the Local Bond Law is included in the estimate cost of the Improvements, as indicated herein.

(c) The Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly prepared and filed in the office of the Borough Clerk and a complete executed duplicate thereof has been filed electronically in the office of the Director, Division of Local Government Services, Department of Community Affairs, State of New Jersey. Such statement shows that the gross debt of the Borough, as defined in the Local Bond Law, is increased by the authorization of the Bonds and Notes provided in this bond ordinance by \$890,000 and the obligations authorized herein will be within all debt limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law.

(d) This bond ordinance authorizes obligations of the Borough solely for purposes described in N.J.S.A. 40A:2-7(h). The obligations authorized herein are to be issued for a purpose that is deemed to be self-liquidating pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:2-47(a) and are deductible from gross debt pursuant to N.J.S.A 40A:2-44(c).

#### SECTION 7:

Any funds received from time to time by the Borough as contributions in aid of financing the purpose described in Section 3 of this Ordinance shall be used for financing said Improvements by application thereof either to direct payment of the cost of said Improvements or to the payment or reduction of the authorization of the obligations of the Borough authorized thereof by this Bond Ordinance. Any such funds received may, and all such funds so received which are not required for direct payment of the cost of said Improvements shall, be held and applied by the Borough as funds applicable only to the payment of obligations of the Borough authorized by this Bond Ordinance.

#### **SECTION 8:**

The full faith and credit of the Borough are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on the obligations authorized by this Bond Ordinance.

The obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the Borough, and the Borough shall be obligated to levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable property within the Borough for the payment of the obligations and the interest thereon without limitation of rate or amount in addition to user fees for water and sewer consumers.

#### **SECTION 9:**

This Bond Ordinance constitutes a declaration of official intent under Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-2. The Borough reasonable expects to pay expenditures with respect to the Improvements prior to the date the Borough incurs debt obligations under this Bond Ordinance. The Borough reasonably expects to reimburse expenditures with the proceeds of debt to be incurred by the Borough under this Bond Ordinance. The maximum principal amount of debt expected to be issued for payment of the costs of the Improvements is \$890,000.00.

# SECTION 10:

This Bond Ordinance shall take effect 20 days after the first publication thereof after the final adoption, as provided by the Local Bond Law.

**NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN,** that the above entitled ordinance was approved on first reading at a meeting of the Governing Body of the Borough of Alpha held on March 12, 2013 at the Alpha Borough Municipal Building on East Blvd., and that public hearing concerning same will be held at a regular meeting of the Mayor and Council on April 9, 2013 at 7:00 p.m. at the Alpha Borough Municipal Building at which time all persons both for and against shall be given the opportunity to be heard concerning the same.

**WHEREAS,** these bills require retraining of poll workers and dramatically increased hours, as well as chain of custody requirements to protect the voting process, despite the fact that recruiting and training polls workers is already a difficult process; and

WHEREAS, these bills would increase costs to municipalities, including overtime pay for workers; and

**WHEREAS,** although these bills allow municipalities to request reimbursement for extra costs and provide an appropriation, the appropriation does not outline a specific amount nor dedicated funding, only that which the State Treasurer and the Director of the Division of Budget and Accounting deem necessary, and they do not outline the procedure for a municipality whose reimbursement request is denied; and

**WHEREAS,** the opportunity for "Early Voting" already exists in the State of New Jersey through the Vote by Mail ballot process.

*Health and Welfare, Councilman Harry Zikas Jr:* Councilwoman Schwar gave a report in the absence of Councilman Zikas. Mrs. Schwar read the Warren County Health report for the month of March. Councilwoman Schwar approved the bills, salaries and wages for this department.

### Committee Reports

Sewer-Councilman Dunwell summarized the Phillipsburg Sewer Authority Committee meeting, which included elected officials from the Town of Phillipsburg and four representatives from sending districts. The committee voted on a 2% increase effective July 1<sup>st</sup> and will be reviewed on an annual basis every year. They were originally asking for 2% every year for five years. Councilman Dunwell explained that Phillipsburg has five votes and Alpha, Lopatcong, Pohatcong and Greenwich each have one vote. Councilman Dunwell stated that these meetings have now opened the dialog between the authority and the surrounding municipalities along with better transparency. Councilman Dunwell added that Phillipsburg Sewer Authority also have requirements from the Delaware River Basin and the DEP that they have to also comply with.

# Professional and Officials Reports

Mayor, Edward Hanics: Mayor Hanics briefed through correspondences that were received though his office.

Mayor Hanics announced a recycling seminar is scheduled for April 11<sup>th</sup>.

In closing of his report, Mayor Hanics requested five minutes in executive session for potential litigation.

Police Chief James Falbourn: Chief Falbourn gave the police report for the month of February.

Chief Falbourn briefly discussed the incident that occurred at the library and stated that it is still an ongoing investigation.

*Fire Chief, Charles Bodogh:* Chief Bodogh reported of an incident that occurred on Third Avenue with saw horses that were lit on fire in the middle of the road.

Chief Bodogh stated he will be submitting a list naming the fire police and drivers to Councilman Cartabona.

*Emergency Squad, Matthew Fagan:* Mr. Fagan gave the report from the Emergency Squad for the months of January and February.

*Emergency Management, Hunter Stagg:* Mr. Stagg reported on the Temporary Debris Management Area application, and stated that it was approved.

*Attorney, Christopher Troxell:* Mr. Troxell asked for a motion to approve the Mayor's signature on a change order for the Safe Routes To School project and asked for a motion to authorize the Mayor to sign. Motion made by Councilman Cartabona authorizing the Mayor's signature, motion seconded by Councilwoman Schwar, all were in favor.

Attorney Troxell proceeded on with his report and requested five minutes in executive session for litigation and ten minutes for contractual. Mr. Troxell requested a resolution be put forth to reimburse Councilman Dunwell of his legal fees.

*CFO, Lorraine Rossetti:* Ms. Rossetti reported briefly on adding another Bond and Capital Rate ordinance for the next meeting.

*Borough Clerk, Laurie A. Barton:* No report. Councilman Savary questioned second notices that were sent out to businesses for mercantile renewals. Councilman Savary asked whose job is it to enforce. Discussions ensued regarding the title and duties of the licensing officer.

*Recycling Coordinator, Tom Fey:* Mr. Fey stated that the tonnage resolution for recycling will be submitted along with the application to the State. A meeting with Waste Management is scheduled to go over concerns that have arisen.

# Public Comment

Charles Bodogh, East Central Avenue, discussed a business in Lyons Electric where an explosion and fire occurred a few years ago. Mr. Bodogh commented that he did not know a business was there and there was no Right To Know forms on file. He stressed it is important to know what all the businesses are in the Borough.

Mr. Bodogh brought up the issue of a missing stop sign on Schley Avenue.

Mr. Bodogh discussed the trees on West Vulcanite Avenue where people are forced to drive into the trees that hang over too low. Councilwoman Schwar stated she will notify the Code Enforcement Officer to send letters to have trees trimmed by the homeowners.

Tim Mellert, North Blvd., inquired about the grant for Schley Avenue.

Jackie Szekers, North Blvd., reported on the flooding that occurs behind her house in the alley way every time it rains. Councilman Dunwell stated he will have the Engineer look at the alley way.
