Public Comment

Tracy Grossman, 7th Avenue, discussed the sidewalks not being installed as originally planned for 7th Avenue. Discussions ensued between Councilman Dunwell and Mrs. Grossman on the project.

Joe Schocko requested the use of borough property for the annual haunted hayride that is scheduled for October. Mr. Schocko gave the dates for the haunted hay ride; October 18th, 19th 25th and 26th.

Mr. Schocko also requested permission to use the mower to cut a trail for the hay ride.

Motion made by Councilman Cartabona granting permission for the hay ride and use of mower, Councilman Dunwell seconded motion, all were in favor.

Mr. Fey inquired about a tax exempt status resolution on the agenda. CFO, Lorraine Rossetti explained reasons for certain tax exemptions.
