The Chief discussed his meeting with Councilman Cartabona and Keith Maxwell from Security Companies regarding cameras being placed throughout the borough and linked to a server so that they can be viewed from the cars and phones of the officers. Chief Falbourne presented details regarding this option and indicated he thinks this would benefit the residents in Alpha as a useful tool to prevent and solve crimes. Councilman Savary inquired about the number of cameras that would be needed and Councilwoman C. Schwar discussed taking a field trip to Phillipsburg to observe how they use it there.

Fire Department, Chief Bodogh: Chief Bodogh gave the fire call report for the month of November and announced Santa coming to the firehouse on Saturday 12/14/2013. Chief Bodogh introduced the new Chief Elect, Sean McDyer.

Councilman Cartabona noted that Chris Leigh and Keith Maxwell were invited to the upcoming budget meeting and that he will contact them about rescheduling.

Attorney, Christopher Troxell: Attorney Troxell had no report.

Engineer's report, including updates for current road projects, the water softener upgrade project regarding the lining, the propane heater conversion at Frace Street, and read a letter for a draft permit from the DEP. Councilman Dunwell indicated the Alpha Street well pump test started and was aborted. Councilman Dunwell stated the Phase 2 Water Utility Improvements are out for bid opening Friday 12/20/13 at 1:30pm and bid will be awarded on 12/30/13. Councilman Dunwell requested ten (10) minutes in executive session for contractual, ten (10) minutes for contractual regarding the water softener, ten (10) minutes for contractual regarding DEP firm capacity, and ten (10) minutes for potential litigation regarding the mold remediation.

CFO, Lorraine Rossetti: Ms. Rossetti discussed the carpet installation in the finance office with regards to the damages to the furniture and the panic wire that was cut, stating ServPro will be in the finance office this Thursday to fix the items and will credit the cost incurred to the borough for services needed by Cooper Alarm to repair the cut wire.
