BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Mayor, Clerk, Borough Attorney, and/or Borough Engineer are

authorized to execute all necessary documents to effectuate the services.

Councilman Zikas read the letter the he submitted to the Clerk's office regarding a

vacancy on Council. Councilman Zikas made a formal motion to recommend Tracy Grossman.

Lengthy discussions ensued regarding the vacancy and time line of filling the vacancy.

Attorney Troxell stated that the list of names has been submitted in a timely manner and

suggested that the Mayor speak to the candidates individually. Mr. Troxell added that a vote

should then be taken at the Re-Organization meeting. Motion dies due to lack of a second.
