ORDINANCE 2014-11 AN ORDINANCE TO VACATE A PORTION OF AVENUE A IN THE BOROUGH OF ALPHA, COUNTY OF WARREN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY

WHEREAS, Avenue A located within the Borough of Alpha, County of Warren, State of New Jersey, was previously dedicated for public use; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Council determined that the public interest will be better served by releasing a small portion of the above-referenced Avenue A, pursuant to *N.J.S.A.* 40:67-19, as this vacation will facilitate the

current and future use of the property on which the roadway is located, and as such property will not be used for residential development.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Governing Body of the Borough of Alpha that a portion of Avenue A be vacated as follows: the fifty foot (50') wide right-of-way running from the end of Avenue A, furthest from Industrial Drive, for approximately two hundred fifty feet (250') in length.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that the Borough of Alpha hereby reserves all of its rights and any rights concerning utility and public easements within such vacated portion of Avenue A, including the right to create public easements therein.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that said Ordinance may be read and inspected at any time at the Office of the Municipal Clerk, Municipal Building, 1001 East Boulevard, Alpha, New Jersey. The Borough Clerk shall, within sixty (60) days of the effective date of this Ordinance, file a copy of this Ordinance certified by her under seal of the Borough to be a true copy thereof, together with a copy of the proof of publication thereof, with the office of the Clerk of the County of Warren in accordance with the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40:67-21. At least one (1) week prior to the time fixed for further consideration of this Ordinance for final passage, a copy thereof together with the notice of the introduction hereof and the time and place when and where the Ordinance will be further considered for final passage shall be mailed to every person whose lands may be affected by this Ordinance so far as may be ascertained. Said notices shall be mailed by the Borough Clerk in accordance with the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40:49-6. The Mayor and Borough Clerk, on behalf of the Borough of Alpha, are hereby authorized to execute any and all instruments and to take any and all steps necessary to effectuate the purposes hereof.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that all ordinances or portions of ordinances which are inconsistent with this Ordinance shall be repealed as to their inconsistencies only. The various parts, sections and clauses of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be severable so that if any part, sentence, paragraph, section or clause of this Ordinance is adjudged unconstitutional or invalidated by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder of this Ordinance shall not be affected thereby. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage and publication as required by law.

John Schmidt, Schley Ave., described the conditions of Dewey Avenue as being horrible and added that the sinkhole has reappeared.

Sean McDyer, Dewey Ave., spoke on the sink hole on Dewey Ave and it being an ongoing issue.

Charles Bodogh, East Central Ave., inquired about overgrown grass at 1034 Central Ave.

Dave Cavanaugh, 6th Ave., asked about the Borough's open space and if it included recreation.
