ORDINANCE 2015-4

BOROUGH OF ALPHA

"CAP" ORDINANCE TO EXCEED INDEX RATE FOR THE YEAR 2015 (N.J.S.40A:4-45.14)

WHEREAS, the Local Government Cap Law, N.J.S.40A:4-45.1 *et seq.*, provides that in the preparation of its annual budget, a municipality shall limit any increase in said budget to 2.0% or the Cost of Living Increase (COLA), whichever is less, over the previous year's final appropriations, subject to certain exceptions; and

WHEREAS, P.L. 1986, C.203 amended the Local Government Cap Law, to provide that a municipality may, in any year in which the index rate is less than 2.0%, increase its final appropriations by a percentage rate greater than the index rate but not to exceed the 3.5% rate as specified in the law, when authorized by ordinance; and

WHEREAS, the COLA rate for 2015 has been certified by the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs as 1.5%; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Council of the Borough of Alpha in the County of Warren finds advisable and necessary to increase its budget by more than 2.0% over the previous year's final appropriations, in the interest of promoting the health, safety, and welfare of the citizens; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Council hereby determines that a 3.5% increase in the budget for said year, amounting to \$50,950.10 in excess of the increase in final appropriations otherwise permitted by the Local Government Cap Law, is advisable and necessary.

WHEREAS, the Borough Council hereby determines that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the Borough Council of the Borough of Alpha, in the County of Warren, a majority of the full authorized membership of this governing body affirmatively concurring that, in the 2015 budget year, the final appropriations of the Borough of Alpha shall, in accordance with this ordinance and P.L. 1986, C.203, and be increased by 3.5%, amounting to \$50,950.10 and that the 2015 municipal budget for the Borough of Alpha be approved and adopted in accordance with this ordinance; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance as introduced be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within 5 days of introduction; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that a certified copy of this ordinance upon adoption, with the recorded vote included thereon, be filed with said Director within 5 days after such adoption.

ORDINANCE 2015-03

ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF ALPHA AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING CODE SECTION CHAPTER 7, ADMINISTRATION OF GOVERNMENT

WHEREAS, the Council of the Borough of Alpha desires to amend a portion of Chapter 7,

Administration of Government, specifically adding the following and amending its Code accordingly;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the Borough of Alpha in the County of Warren and State of New Jersey that "Chapter 7, Administration of Government, Article XI" be amended and supplemented as follows:

7-36. Rules applicable to Borough Council Members.

Members of the Borough Council shall observe order and decorum during Borough Council meetings. A member of the Borough Council shall neither, by conversation or otherwise, delay or interrupt the proceedings of the Council nor disturb any member while speaking nor refuse to obey the orders of the Mayor.

7-37. Borough staff.

Members of the Borough staff shall observe the same rules of order and decorum applicable to the Borough Council in 7-36 above.

7-38. Defamatory and threatening language prohibited.

Any person(s) making personal, defamatory or profane remarks or who willfully utters loud, threatening or abusive language or engages in any disorderly conduct which disturbs or disrupts the orderly conduct of any meeting shall be called to order by the Mayor. If such conduct continues, the Mayor of the Borough of Alpha, at his or her discretion, may order such person removed from that meeting.

7-39. Length of presentation; governmental issues.

During any public comment portion of the public meeting, persons addressing the Borough Council shall each be allowed a maximum of five (5) minutes for their comments or presentations and may comment on any governmental issue that a member of the public feels may be of concern to the residents of the community.

7-40. Disorderly conduct.

No person in the audience shall engage in disorderly conduct such as handclapping, stomping of feet, whistling, using profane language, shouting or other similar demonstrations which may disturb the peace and order of the Borough Council meeting.

7-41. Repeated disturbance; removal from meeting.

All persons shall, at the request of the Mayor, be silent. If, after receiving a warning from the Mayor, a person persists in disturbing the meeting, the Mayor may order that person to leave the meeting. If he does not remove himself, the Mayor may order his removal by the Sergeant at Arms.

7-42. Sergeant at Arms.

The Chief of Police of the department covering the Borough of Alpha, or such member of said department of police as the Mayor may designate, shall be Sergeant at Arms at the Borough Council meetings. The Sergeant at Arms shall carry out all orders given by the Mayor for the purpose of maintaining order and decorum at the Borough Council meeting. On the instruction of the Mayor, the Sergeant at Arms shall remove from the meeting any person who disturbs the proceedings of the Council.

7-43. Resisting Removal.

Any person who resists removal by the Sergeant at Arms shall be charged with violating *N.J.S.A*2C:33-8, Disrupting meetings and processions, or other relevant statute.

7-44. Rules of Conduct.

Borough Council meetings shall be conducted pursuant to Robert's Rules of Order. This Ordinance shall take effect after adoption and publication thereof as provided by law.

Mr. Small questioned the Mayor on addressing the public directly.

Jodie Smith, 5th Ave., stated the five minutes limit is a good idea and added that she is in favor of bringing back a second public comment to the agenda.

Motion made by Councilman Cartabona to close the public hearing, motion seconded by Councilman Rooks, all were in favor.

RESOLUTION 2015-70 RESOLUTION OF THE BOROUGH OF ALPHA, COUNTY OF WARREN AND STATE OF NEW JERSEY SUPPORTING THE TRANSPARENT TAX ACT OF 2015

WHEREAS, Assembly Bill No. A-4325 supplementing Chapter 4 of Title 54, R.S. 54:4-65 and designated the "Transparent Tax Act of 2015" is being considered for adoption by the New Jersey State Assembly; and

WHEREAS, the amendment would permit the local jurisdiction to print separate tax bills to each taxpayer, one showing the amount of property taxes due and payable for municipal tax purposes, the other shall state the amount of property taxes due and payable for county purposes, school purposes, fire district purposes, and for the purpose of any other special district on behalf of which the municipality collect property taxes; and

WHEREAS, both bills shall include a brief tabulation showing the distribution of the total amount to be raised by taxes; and

WHEREAS, A-4325 would require the municipal tax collector to send notice of pro rata share, if any, of the property tax appeal refunds paid by the municipality during the tax year to the county, school districts and fire districts for inclusion in their annual budgets; and

WHEREAS, in the following tax year in which the refunds were paid, the municipal tax collector is then required to deduct the applicable pro rata share of the property tax refund from the amounts to be paid to the county and each school and fire districts; and

WHEREAS, these amendments if adopted will assist the general public to understand the tax bill, the structure of the taxes and the level of support for each agency and will further provide a more equitable structure to share the obligation of paying approved tax appeals as the title states, creates transparency in the tax supporting local assessments.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Alpha, County of Warren, and State of New Jersey hereby supports the Assembly Bill A-4235 amending Title 54:4-65 and urges the Legislature to approve and pass the bill for the reasons expressed herein.
