Department Reports:

Administration, Councilman Peter Pettinelli: Councilman Pettinelli gave the following report: Late fee notices have been sent to Mercantiles. Seeking a second quote on computer service. Jewel is \$600 per year/5months. EMC(2) is \$850 per year/unlimited. Councilman Schwar stated to check with the Clerk to see how many hours we have used in the past and see which would be cheaper. In closing Councilman Pettinelli approved bills, salaries and wages for his department.

Finance, Councilman Michael Schwar: Councilman Schwar gave the following report: Dealing with 6 people on water/sewer issues. Landlord with a 4 unit building called to tell us resident has a leaky toilet, bill went up, Council agreed needs to pay bill. Gone over the Bond and found items charged that shouldn't be and some items not charged that should be. Councilman Schwar discussed the fee for the CFO training and it will now be \$7,000 for training and assisting. Mentioned letter from Senate Majority Leader Loretta Weinberg that she is looking to change OPRA and Open Public Meetings Act. Mr. Canace said there is money in escrow for Open Space acquisition. Sharon Cooper, PAIC Rep, quoting us and said most companies are going with insurance for cyber liability (computer hacking). Playgrounds have been inspected and we will be receiving reports. Ms. Cooper is concerned about roof at Benke Field. Amount we are collecting for sewer will not be more.

Health & Welfare, Councilman Louis Cartabona: Councilman Cartabona gave the following report: Received mosquito report, West Nile found. Urging people to stay away from dead birds, standing water, etc. Councilman Pettinelli asked what the days are for the dump. Councilman Cartabona stated Wednesday, Saturday, and Sunday. Councilman Seiss stated the gates have stayed open and asked who is responsible for locking them. Police are to lock them. Charlie Olah opens them. Councilman Cartabona asked for 5 minutes in Executive session for personnel, Code Enforcement Officer. In closing, Councilman Cartabona approved bills, salaries and wages for his department.

Public Safety, Councilman Millard Rooks: Councilman Rooks stated that the new fire truck is being delivered around Labor Day. Attended Fire Department meeting and majority are in favor of selling the old truck. If kept, there is nowhere to store it. Councilman Cartabona feels we should keep and store the old truck. Mayor Hanics said

the truck will be stripped of many things to put on the new truck so those things don't need to be purchased. Councilman Pettinelli asked if there is anywhere in Phillipsburg to house the old truck. In closing, Councilman Rooks approved bills, salaries and wages for his department.

Public Works, Councilman Seiss: Councilman Seiss reported that Pohatcong fixed the water leak. Service was never taken back. In closing, Councilman Seiss approved bills, salaries and wages for his department

Professionals & Official Reports:

Mayor, Edward Hanics, Jr.: Mayor Hanics briefly stated that he is forwarding a correspondence received through his office to Mr. Seeney for him to review.

Police Department, Chief James Faulborn: Chief Faulborn provided the number of calls handled within the last month in the Borough and the category of the calls. Chief Faulborn stated that the Police will be responsible for locking the gates to the dump at 8pm.

Emergency Squad: No report, however, Councilman Seiss stated the old water meter was reinstalled and the new water meter has to go back in at the Emergency Squad building. Councilman Pettinelli requested five minutes executive session to discuss.

Attorney, Christopher Troxell: Stated he sent letters regarding permits. Mr. Troxell requested five minutes executive session for Contractual.

Engineer, Frank J. Seney: Mr. Seeney stated they are putting information in order to submit the grant for the generator, and will have a meeting tomorrow. Provided update on 7th Avenue regarding vertical curve. Spoke of the Green Acres open space grant, evaluation, and added that Stephanie will be negotiating.

CFO, Charles Daniel: Completed EPIC training for Pension system. Submitted Resolution for hiring Phoenix to handle Bond issues.
