Lengthy discussions ensued regarding a grant the Borough could pursue regarding the Leigh Fuel property for a preliminary assessment in the amount of \$3,000.00.

Sewer Engineer, Jim Hill: Mr. Hill stated that he is currently focusing on the meter pit and the pump station on having those projects competed.

Payment of Bills & Claims:

Councilman Seiss made a motion to make the director's report a part of the minutes. Councilman Cartabona seconded the motion, all were in favor.

Councilman Rooks made a motion that the CFO be authorized to pay all bills authorized by the director. Councilwoman Grossman seconded the motion. Roll call; Ayes: Cartabona, Grossman, Pettinelli, Pettinelli, Schwar, and Seiss. Nays: none.
