Motion made by Councilman Cartabona to adopt Ordinance 2015-06, motion seconded by Councilwoman Grossman. Roll call: Ayes: Cartabona, Grossman, Pettinelli, Rooks, Schwar and Seiss. Nays: none.

ORDINANCE 2015-06 THIRD PARTY PAYROLL DISBURSEMENT AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF ALPHA ESTABLISHING CHAPTER 70 "THIRD-PARTY PAYROLL DISBURSEMENT"

WHEREAS, the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey adopted formal rules regarding "Electronic Disbursement Controls for Payroll Purposes" in order to provide formal authority for local governments to hire third-party payroll services/disbursing services to disburse funds to payroll agencies; and

WHEREAS, in order to have a payroll servicer provide disbursement services, the Borough Council of the

Borough of Alpha must formally approve the principle of a third-party having access to Borough funds, formally assigning responsibility to an official to oversee the process by enacting an ordinance, and approving all contracts or extensions.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Governing Body of the Borough of Alpha, County of Warren and State of New Jersey that Chapter 70 entitled "Third-Party Payroll Disbursement" is hereby established in the Borough Code:

CHAPTER 70 "Third-Party Payroll Disbursement"

§ 70-1. Purpose; definitions.

A. The purpose and intent of these regulations is to abide by the requirements of N.J.S.A. 52:27D-20.1 and N.J.A.C. 5:30-17.1 et seq., governing electronic disbursement controls for payroll purposes.

B. Definitions. As used in this chapter, the following terms shall have the meanings indicated: "Approval Officer"

Person(s) responsible for authorizing and supervising the activities of the payroll service. "Payroll Service"

Third-party payroll service organization.

"Borough" Borough of Alpha.

§ 70-2. Authorization.

A. The Borough is authorized to use a payroll service to prepare payment documentation, take possession of Borough funds, and make such disbursements itself on behalf of the Borough.

B. The following payroll service providers shall be required to comply with these regulations:

- (1) Payroll service providers who use their own customized programming process to execute disbursements for the Borough;
 - (2) Payroll service providers who use a third-party processor to execute disbursements for the Borough.

§ 70-3. Borough requirements.

A. The appointment of a payroll service shall be pursuant to the Local Public Contracts Law, See N.J.S.A. 40A:11-1 et seq. and shall require the contractor to do the following, not by way of limitation: data collection, agency report preparation, calculation of withholding, direct deposit of payroll disbursements, and/or transfer of Borough funds to contractor's account for subsequent disbursement of payment.

B. Any renewal or extension of a contract under these regulations shall be by resolution.

C. The Chief Financial Officer is hereby appointed the approval officer and is responsible for authorizing and supervising the activities of the payroll service and shall further be charged with the reconciliation and analysis of all general ledger accounts affected by the activities of the disbursing organization.

D. If required by the contract between the Borough and the payroll service, the payroll service is permitted to hold Borough funds pending transmittal to a payee.

§ 70-4. Payroll service requirements.

- A. A payroll service must meet all of the following requirements:
 - (1) Report any irregularities that may indicate potential fraud, noncompliance with appropriate laws, dishonesty or gross incompetence on the part of the approval officer;

(2) Report circumstances that could jeopardize its ability to continue operations or otherwise interrupt the services provided to the Borough.

B. A payroll service must meet the requirements of N.J.A.C. 5:30-17.5, requiring that the approval officer be assured that the servicer has its own internal controls and appropriately guard against theft and other adverse conditions.

C. All contracts entered into pursuant to these regulations and the laws authorizing the same shall comply with the requirements of N.J.A.C. 5:30-17.6, which sets out a series of mandatory contractual terms and conditions.

§ 70-5. Establishment of service.

Upon the adoption of these regulations, the Borough Manager, with the assistance of the Chief Financial Officer and Borough Attorney, as necessary, is hereby authorized and directed to enter into a contract for payroll service in accordance with all local public contracting laws and N.J.A.C. 5:30-17. Appointment of the payroll service shall be by separate resolution of the Borough.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that if any section, paragraph, subsection, clause or provision of this Ordinance shall be adjudged by the courts to be invalid, such adjudication shall apply only to the section, paragraph, subsection, clause or provisions so adjudicated, and the remainder of the Ordinance shall be deemed valid and effective; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that any ordinances or parts thereof in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are repealed to the extent of such conflict; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that this Ordinance shall take effect upon passage and publication in accordance with applicable law.

BOROUGH OF ALPHA RESOLUTION 2015-116 SHARED SERVICE AMENDED CONTRACT

WHEREAS, the Borough Council of the Borough of Alpha entered into the Municipal Shared Services Defense Agreement ("MSSDA") for the purpose as set forth therein, which included retaining a common expert in the Declaratory Judgment action ("Litigation") that was filed in accordance with <u>In the Matter of the Adoption of N.J.A.C. 5:96 and 5:97 by the New Jersey Council on Affordable Housing</u>, 221 <u>N.J.</u> 1 (2015) ("Decision"); and

WHEREAS, the MSSDA identified Dr. Robert Burchell, a distinguished professor at Rutgers University, as the expert to be retained; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Burchell became ill and has been unable to complete the obligations under the Research Agreement as set forth in the MSSDA; and

WHEREAS, as a result, Rutgers University has exercised its right to terminate the Research Agreement as permitted under its terms; and

WHEREAS, the MSSDA requires modification to allow the members to retain one or more alternative experts, consultants and/or other professionals for the Litigation; and

WHEREAS, an Amendment to the MSSDA ("Amendment") has been prepared to effectuate the modification; an

WHEREAS, the Borough Council of the Borough of Alpha recognizes that the Litigation requires immediate action and may require further expedited actions by its counsel determined to be necessary and appropriate; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Council of the Borough of Alpha has determined that it is in the best interests of the citizens of the Borough of Alpha to approve the Amendment, and/or to affirm and ratify the Amendment, and to authorize their designated counsel to take actions on behalf of the municipality with regard to the multiplicity of issues raised and associated with the continued implementation of the MSSDA;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Borough Council of the Borough of Alpha, as follows:

- 1. The terms and conditions of the Amendment to MSSDA attached hereto are hereby approved, and/or ratified and confirmed.
- 2. The Mayor and Borough Clerk or Deputy Clerk, be and are hereby authorized to execute the aforesaid Amendment.
- 3. The Borough Council of the Borough of Alpha hereby authorizes Jeffrey R. Surenian, Esq., to execute an agreement on behalf of the Borough of Alpha with Econsult Solutions, Inc.

The Borough Council of the Borough of Alpha hereby authorizes Jeffrey R. Surenian, Esq., to execute on behalf of the Borough of Alpha with the approval of the Borough of Alpha's designated counsel such other agreement(s) as are advisable to effectuate the purposes of the MSSDA as amended.

4. The Borough Council of the Borough of Alpha further authorizes its designated counsel to approve such other changes to the MSSDA as may be necessary to effectuate its purposes, and to take action on behalf of the municipality with regard to the multiplicity of issues raised and associated with the implementation of the MSSDA provided that the action will not require the municipality to appropriate and commit any additional funding for the MSSDA.

In the event such changes and actions require the municipality to appropriate and commit any additional funding for the MSSDA, the Borough of Alpha shall only be responsible for such funding if it authorizes same.

- 5. If additional monies are needed to effectuate the intent and purpose of the MSSDA, no such services shall be authorized by designated counsel without further action from the Borough of Alpha.
- 6. This Resolution shall take effect immediately.

Public Safety, Councilman Millard Rooks: No report. Councilman Rooks approved bills, salaries and wages for his department.

Public Works, Councilman Thomas Seiss: Councilman Seiss reported that paving started yesterday and should be done by end of the week. Councilman Seiss stated there is an issue with the Leona Avenue sewer line and requested 15 minutes in executive session for contractual.

Professionals and Officials Reports

Mayor, Edward Hanics, Jr: Mayor Hanics asked what the procedure would be to have a handicap sign put up on East Blvd., for Leonard Fuccili. Councilman Seiss stated that once they have the handicap permit #, he can instruct the DPW to install the sign.

Mayor Hanics requested five minutes in executive session to discuss litigation.

Mayor Hanics reported on the library meeting that was held last night and stated that there are two resignations on the board. Mayor Hanics stated that the two candidates are here tonight and would like a motion to appoint Steve Knoll and Ann Harp to the library board for the unexpired terms and also to include new three year terms. Councilman Cartabona questioned who resigned and was this for the remainder of the terms? Mayor Hanics stated that they are replacing Dave Miers and Nancy Serrone. this would be remainder of the terms and for a three year term. Motion made by Councilman Schwar to approve the appointment, motion seconded by Councilwoman Grossman. Roll call: Ayes: Cartabona, Grossman, Pettinelli, Rooks, Schwar and Seiss. Nays: none.

Emergency Squad, Russ Bogely: Mr. Bogoly gave the report from the squad for the months of August and September. They are in the process of getting a volunteer to stay and answer calls from the new building here in Alpha. Currently there are only weekend shifts at the new building. There are two ambulances stationed there ready to go. There are some members waiting to be certified. The Emergency Squad was able to get 40 new volunteers this past summer.

Attorney, Christopher Troxell: Mr. Troxell requested 20 minutes total for executive session for contractual and litigation.

Engineer, Frank Seney: Mr. Seney reported that the resolution of support for the grant for Schley Avenue has been forwarded to the DOT and is hoping to hear something by the end of the month for approval.

The final numbers for the redundancy project is from PACT; \$190,000.00. The valve and pipe project is waiting for more items to come in and should be completed by next week.

Sewer Engineer, Jim Hill: Mr. Hill gave updates on manholes and stated that there are approximately 10 manholes left to do. Leona Avenue is starting to be repaired, in which the line was at a deeper depth than anticipated. This will cost an additional \$15,500.00. Mr. Hill stated that he will need approval at this meeting or next to proceed.

Discussions of the odor control ensued with questions from the Mayor and Council questioning the current method.

CFO, Charles Daniel: Mr. Daniel reported that the assistant is working on past bills from Remington & Vernick dating back to 2014. Mr. Daniel reported that the funds of the Open Space cash management will be transferred to PNC Bank.

Mr. Daniel reported that he will be out for two weeks to study for his CFO test which is scheduled for December 1st.

Clerk, Laurie Barton: Ms. Barton reported that the renewal forms will be going out soon for mercantiles and added that the late fee ordinance will also be on the form this year.

Library, Sue Smeal: Ms. Smeal reported that on November 23rd the librarian will be doing thanksgiving crafts starting at 5:30 P.M.

Public Comment

Leo Pursel, High Street, inquired about the Safe Routes to School project and asked if sidewalks will be considered.

Mr. Pursel also commented that the roof on Benke Field is bad.

Mike Savary, Park Ave., asked if there's a plan for the roof at Benke Field. Mr. Savary inquired about what is being done for businesses that don't have a mercantile license.

Councilman Cartabona made a motion to make the director's reports part of the minutes. Councilman Pettinelli, seconded the motion, all were in favor.
