#### ORDINANCE 2015-07 WATER DELINQUENT PAYMENT OF BILLS

WHEREAS, the Council of the Borough of Alpha desires to amend a portion of Chapter 403-18

Payment of Bills, , specifically adding the following and amending its Code accordingly;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the Borough of Alpha in the

County of Warren and State of New Jersey that "Chapter 403, Payment of Bills be amended and

supplemented as follows:

403-18 Payment of bills

## <u>A.</u>

All bills for water, except under billing permits, shall be payable on the first day of January, April, July and October. Any balance not paid within 15 days from the due date will be subject to interest calculated at 8% per annum from the due date. If the amount due is greater than \$1,500, the interest will be calculated at a rate of 18% per annum from the due date. Also, any account which is in arrears for greater than six months, upon notice and in addition to the interest, may be subject to having the water turned off. Delinquency or maintaining an outstanding balance for a period of four consecutive quarters shall also constitute grounds for the water being turned off, upon notice and in addition to interest. Outstanding balances of arrearages for greater than six months may not be carried forward to the next year (by simply paying the minimum); same will be considered delinquent and subject to the turn-off hereinabove described, upon notice and in addition to interest. Any account where the water is turned off shall not have the water turned on again

until the entire balance(s) of the water and sewer account(s) are paid in full and the fee as set forth in §  $\underline{403}$ - $\underline{21B}$  has been paid.

<u>B.</u>

All unpaid water bills and other water charges shall become liens on the real estate benefiting from the water service, as provided by law, including the New Jersey Revised Statutes.

## RESOLUTION 2015-119

### RESOLUTION APPOINTING AND AUTHORIZING THE BOROUGH ENGINEER AND/OR DIRECTOR OF THE BOROUGH'S DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS TO NEGOTIATE A CONTRACT FOR REDUNDANCY UPGRADES AT FRACE STREET WATER TREATMENT PLANT

**WHEREAS**, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Alpha have determined that certain improvements are needed for the Borough's potable water system, including but not limited to redundancy upgrades at the Frace Street water treatment plant; and

**WHEREAS,** the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Alpha have openly and publicly bid such contract for said improvement work – specifically redundancy upgrades at the Frace Street water treatment plant – twice, pursuant to New Jersey law; and

**WHEREAS,** the Mayor and the Council of the Borough of Alpha have rejected all bids by resolution(s); and

**WHEREAS**, *N.J.S.A.40A:11-1, et seq.*, specifically 40A:11-5(3), allows for negotiating where the contract has been bid twice and bids are rejected twice for being too high or a combination of factors; and

**WHEREAS**, *N.J.S.A*. 11-5(3) provides that two thirds the members of council must vote to pass a resolution to negotiate a contract on similar terms and conditions like those in the contract that had been bid and rejected twice; and

**WHEREAS**, *N.J.S.A*.11-5(3) provides that the negotiated price must be lower than the lowest responsible bid that had been rejected.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, by the Borough Council of the Borough of Alpha, County of Warren, State of New Jersey that the Borough Engineer and/or the Director of the Borough's Department of Public Works be hereby appointed and authorized to negotiate a contract for the contemplated work for which bids have been sought twice and have been rejected twice – specifically redundancy upgrades at the Frace Street water treatment plant – understanding the negotiated price for the contract must be lower than the lowest responsible bid that has been rejected by the Borough Council. **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED,** that the Mayor, Clerk, Director of the Department of Public Works and/or Borough Engineer are authorized to execute all necessary documents to effectuate such negotiation of said contract.

Councilman Schwar stated a new computer will be ordered for that department (Water/Sewer/Tax). In closing, Councilman Pettinelli approved all bills, salaries, and wages for his department.

*Finance, Councilman Schwar:* Councilman Schwar reminded everyone that the CFO will be out of the office until 12/2. There is a bond sale coming up. He has an insurance meeting on December 1<sup>st</sup> so if anyone has anything they would like brought up or questions to be asked to bring them to him. Councilman Schwar is still looking into cyber liability insurance. The Budget meeting is scheduled for December 15<sup>th</sup>, if anyone needs anything from the CFO, please see him on December 3<sup>rd</sup>. Councilman Seiss stated he has not received the budget sheets for water/sewer and he will be leaving this Sunday and not returning until December 12<sup>th</sup>. Councilman Schwar approved all bills, salaries, and wages for his department.

*Health & Welfare, Councilman Cartabona:* Councilman Schwar discussed the old dumpster at the school and having it moved. Councilman Schwar approved bills, salaries and wages for this department.

*Public Property, Councilwoman Grossman:* Councilwoman Grossman stated that Pohatcong will be using the field house for wrestling. Port a Johns will be pulled out on Monday. Estimate for diffusers was \$1,300.00 from Trane for the municipal building. Councilman Seiss asked her to hold off. Councilwoman Grossman approved all bills, salaries, and wages for her department. *Public Safety, Councilman Rooks:* No report. Councilman Seiss requested 10 minutes in executive session regarding Police contract. Councilman Seiss approved bills, salaries and wages for his department.

*Public Works, Councilman Seiss:* Councilman Seiss gave an update on the pavement project. He stated he was contacted via email regarding a meeting concerning all projects. Councilman Seiss stated he does not approve of the meeting. He will not be here for it. Councilman Seiss approved all bills, wages, and salaries for his department.

# Professionals & Official Reports

*Attorney, Christopher Troxell:* Attorney Troxell spoke about the report received by Stephanie, he wasn't sure of the original cost, asked about Tom & Frank's negotiation with Jim Hill for manholes. Attorney Troxell wrote up a resolution regarding such to be permitted. Frank Seney spoke of Engineer's two original bids.

*Engineer – Frank J. Seney*: Mr. Seney provided the report summary that was distributed. Mr. Seney brought an application to tonight's meeting and gave to the Deputy to give to the Mayor. Frank Seney stated they are monitoring the grant. Other project updates: valve project, have completed demolition and starting sometime next week. Councilman Seiss stated there is a lot more to do. Asked why we don't have electricians there. Frank stated he will follow up.

*Sewer Engineer – Jim Hill*: Mr. Hill reported things are closing down for active work. Working on budgeting for 2016. Will have report before the budget meeting.

Councilman Schwar asked if there is a way to document how many feet the manholes are down into the ground, referring to Aurora Street. Jim Hill stated he has begun to document. Will be needed if borough should ever go out to bid.

Councilman Schwar requested 10 minutes executive session for contractual regarding Open Space purchase and five minutes executive session for litigation regarding water/sewer.

Councilman Seiss requested 15 minutes executive session for contractual regarding engineer.

# Public Comment:

Jerry Kern, Pohatcong resident, inquired about his sewer billed by Alpha Borough. Asked about payment resolution regarding the billing. Lengthy discussions ensued with regards to incorrect billing and the estimated bills. Councilman Schwar stated it needs to be discussed in executive session, would Mr. Kern like to do this tonight or at the next meeting when there will be more council members present. Mr. Kern stated he would just like an answer. Councilman Schwar stated that it will be taken up at the December 8<sup>th</sup> meeting.

Craig Dunwell, 1159 Seventh Avenue, asked Mr. Kern if he had a new or old meter. He had an old meter. New meter will give actual reading that's what is used to go back. Mr. Kern stated that it isn't fair in his situation. Doesn't alleviate the fact that someone in the Borough made up numbers for his billing.

Craig Dunwell, 1159 Seventh Avenue, asked Council where the total cost to Frank Seney will be coming from. Mr. Dunwell began going over financing on the white board because Councilman Seiss inquired about it. Councilman Pettinelli asked for a written copy. Mr. Dunwell said he will provide it before the budget meeting.
