ORDINANCE 2016-5 BOND ORDINANCE PROVIDING AN APPROPRIATION OF \$750,000 FOR VARIOUS CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS IN AND BY THE BOROUGH OF ALPHA, IN THE COUNTY OF **NEW JERSEY** WARREN, AND **AUTHORIZING** THE OF \$600,000 BONDS OR NOTES OF ISSUANCE THE BOROUGH **FOR** FINANCING **PART**

APPROPRIATION.

BE IT ORDAINED, BY THE BOROUGH COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF ALPHA, IN THE COUNTY OF WARREN, NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all members thereof affirmatively concurring) AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1:

The improvement described in Section 3 of this Bond Ordinance (the "Improvement") is hereby authorized to be undertaken by the Borough of Alpha, in the County of Warren, New Jersey (the "Borough") as a general improvement. For the said Improvement there is hereby appropriated the amount of \$750,000, such sum includes the sum of \$150,000 as the down payment (the "Down Payment") required by the Local Bond Law of the State of New Jersey, constituting Chapter 2 of Title 40A of the New Jersey Statutes, as amended and supplemented (the "Local Bond Law"). The Down Payment is now available by virtue of provision in one or more previously adopted budgets for down payments for capital improvement purposes.

SECTION 2:

In order to finance the additional cost of the Improvement not covered by application of the Down Payment, negotiable bonds of the Borough are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount of \$600,000 pursuant to the provisions of the Local Bond Law (the "Bonds"). In anticipation of the issuance of the Bonds and to temporarily finance said Improvement or purposes, negotiable bond anticipation notes of the Borough are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount not exceeding \$600,000 pursuant to the provisions of the Local Bond Law (the "Bond Anticipation Notes").

SECTION 3:

The Improvements hereby authorized and the purposes for the financing of which said obligations are to be issued, the estimated cost of each Improvement and the appropriation therefor, the estimated maximum amount of bond or notes to be issued for each Improvement and the period of usefulness of each Improvement are as follows:

- (a) The estimated maximum amount of Bonds or Notes to be issued for the purpose of financing a portion of the cost of the Improvement is \$600,000.
- (b) The estimated cost of the Improvement is \$750,000 which amount represents the initial appropriation made by the Borough.

SECTION 4:

All Bond Anticipation Notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as may be determined by the municipal finance officer of the Borough (the "Chief Financial Officer"); provided that no Note shall mature later than one year from its date. The Notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and be in such form as may be determined by the Chief Financial Officer. The Chief Financial Officer shall determine all matters in connection with Notes issued pursuant to this ordinance, and the signature of the Chief Financial Officer upon the Notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. All Notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the provisions of Section 8(a) of the Local Bond Law. The Chief Financial Officer is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the Notes from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver them to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the date of delivery thereof. The Chief Financial Officer is directed to report in writing to the Borough Council of the Borough at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of the Notes pursuant to this ordinance is made. Such report must include the amount, the description, the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the Notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

SECTION 5:

The capital budget of the Borough is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this Ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. The resolution in the form promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director, Division of Local Government Services, Department of Community Affairs, State of New Jersey is on file with the Borough Municipal Clerk and is available for public inspection.

SECTION 6:

The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared, recited and stated:

- (a) The Improvement described in Section 3 of this Bond Ordinance is not a current expense, and is a capital improvement or property that the Borough may lawfully make or acquire as general improvements, and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property specially benefited thereby.
- (b) The period of usefulness of the Improvement, within the limitations of the Local Bond Law, taking into consideration the respective amounts of all obligations authorized for such purpose, according to the reasonable life thereof computed from the date of the Bonds authorized by this Bond Ordinance, is 16.46 years.
- (c) The Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly prepared and filed in the office of the Borough Municipal Clerk and a complete executed duplicate thereof has been filed in the office of the Director, Division of Local Government Services, Department of Community Affairs, State of New Jersey. Such statement shows that the gross debt of the Borough, as defined in the Local Bond Law, is increased by the authorization of the Bonds and Notes provided in this Bond Ordinance by \$600,000 and the obligations authorized herein will be within all debt limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law.
- (d) An aggregate amount not exceeding \$250,000 for items of expense listed in and permitted under Section 20 of the Local Bond Law is included in the estimated cost of the Improvements, as indicated herein.

SECTION 7:

Any funds or grant monies received for the purpose described in Section 3 of this Ordinance shall be used for financing said Improvement by application thereof either to direct payment of the cost of said Improvement or to the payment or reduction of the authorization of the obligations of the Borough authorized therefor by this Bond Ordinance. Any such funds received may, and all such funds so received which are not required for direct payment of the cost of said Improvement shall, be held and applied by the Borough as funds applicable only to the payment of obligations of the Borough authorized by this Bond Ordinance.

SECTION 8:

The full faith and credit of the Borough are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on the obligations authorized by this Bond Ordinance. The obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the Borough, and the Borough shall be obligated to levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable property within the Borough for the payment of the obligations and the interest thereon without limitation of rate or amount.

SECTION 9:

This Bond Ordinance constitutes a declaration of official intent under Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-2. The Borough reasonably expects to pay expenditures with respect to the Improvement prior to the date that Borough incurs debt obligations under this Bond Ordinance. The Borough reasonably expects to reimburse such expenditures with the proceeds of debt to be incurred by the Borough under this Bond Ordinance. The maximum principal amount of debt expected to be issued for payment of the cost of the Improvement is \$600,000.

SECTION 10:

This Bond Ordinance shall take effect 20 days after the first publication thereof after final adoption, as provided by the Local Bond Law.

ORDINANCE 2016-7 "CAP" ORDINANCE TO EXCEED INDEX RATE FOR THE YEAR 2016 (N.J.S. 40A: 4-45.14)

WHEREAS, the Local Government Cap Law, N.J.S. 40A: 4-45.14 et seq., provides that in the preparation of its annual budget, a municipality shall limit any increase in said budget to 2.0% or the Cost of Living Increase (COLA), whichever is less, over the previous year's final appropriations, subject to certain exceptions; and

WHEREAS, P.L. 1986, C.203 amended the Local Government Cap Law, to provide that a municipality may, in any year in which the index rate is less than 2.0% increase its final appropriations by a

percentage rate greater than the index rate but not to exceed the 3.5% rate as specified in law, when authorized by ordinance, and

WHEREAS, the COLA rate for 2016 has been certified by the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs as 0.0%; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Council of the Borough of Alpha in the County of Warren finds it advisable and necessary to increase its budget by more than 2.0% over the previous year's final appropriations, in the interest of promoting health, safety and welfare of the citizens; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Council hereby determines that a 3.5% increase in the budget for said year, amounting to \$50,300.46 in excess of the increases in final appropriations otherwise permitted by the Local Government Cap Law, is advisable and necessary.

WHEREAS, the Borough Council hereby determines that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be regained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Borough Council of the Borough of Alpha, in the County of Warren, a majority of the full authorized membership of this governing body affirmatively concurring that, in the 2016 budget year, the final appropriations of the Borough of Alpha shall, in accordance with this ordinance and P.L. 1986, C. 203, and be increased by 3.5% amounting to \$50,300.46 and that the 2016 municipal budget for the Borough of Alpha be approved and adopted in accordance with this ordinance; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either if the next two succeeding years; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance as introduced be filed with the Director of Division of Local Government Services within 5 days of introduction; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance upon adoption, with the recorded vote included thereon, be filed with said Director within 5 days after such adoption.

The Chief Financial Officer shall determine all matters in connection with Notes issued pursuant to this ordinance, and the signature of the Chief Financial Officer upon the Notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. All Notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the provisions of Section 8(a) of the Local Bond Law. The Chief Financial Officer is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the Notes from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver them to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the date of delivery thereof. The Chief Financial Officer is directed to report in writing to the Borough Council of the Borough at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of the Notes pursuant to this ordinance is made. Such report must include the amount, the description, the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the Notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

SECTION 15:

The capital budget of the Borough is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this Ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. The resolution in the form promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director, Division of Local Government Services, Department of Community Affairs, State of New Jersey is on file with the Borough Municipal Clerk and is available for public inspection.

SECTION 16:

The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared, recited and stated:

- (a) The Improvement described in Section 3 of this Bond Ordinance is not a current expense, and is a capital improvement or property that the Borough may lawfully make or acquire as general improvements, and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property specially benefited thereby.
- (b) The period of usefulness of the Improvement, within the limitations of the Local Bond Law, taking into consideration the respective amounts of all obligations authorized for such purpose, according to the reasonable life thereof computed from the date of the Bonds authorized by this Bond Ordinance, is 40 years.
- (c) The Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly prepared and filed in the office of the Borough Municipal Clerk and a complete executed duplicate thereof has been filed in the office of the Director, Division of Local Government Services, Department of Community Affairs, State of New Jersey. Such statement shows that the gross debt of the Borough, as defined in the Local Bond Law, is increased by the authorization of the Bonds and Notes provided in this Bond Ordinance by \$950,000 and the obligations authorized herein will be within all debt limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law.
- (d) An aggregate amount not exceeding \$350,000 for items of expense listed in and permitted under Section 20 of the Local Bond Law is included in the estimated cost of the Improvements, as indicated herein.

SECTION 17:

Any funds or grant monies received for the purpose described in Section 3 of this Ordinance shall be used for financing said Improvement by application thereof either to direct payment of the cost of said Improvement or to the payment or reduction of the authorization of the obligations of the Borough authorized therefor by this Bond Ordinance. Any such funds received may, and all such funds so received which are not required for direct payment of the cost of said Improvement shall, be held and applied by the Borough as funds applicable only to the payment of obligations of the Borough authorized by this Bond Ordinance.

SECTION 18:

The full faith and credit of the Borough are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on the obligations authorized by this Bond Ordinance. The obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the Borough, and the Borough shall be obligated to levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable property within the Borough for the payment of the obligations and the interest thereon without limitation of rate or amount.

SECTION 19:

This Bond Ordinance constitutes a declaration of official intent under Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-2. The Borough reasonably expects to pay expenditures with respect to the Improvement prior to the date that Borough incurs debt obligations under this Bond Ordinance. The Borough reasonably expects to reimburse such expenditures with the proceeds of debt to be incurred by the Borough under this Bond Ordinance. The maximum principal amount of debt expected to be issued for payment of the cost of the Improvement is \$950,000.

SECTION 20:

This Bond Ordinance shall take effect 20 days after the first publication thereof after final adoption, as provided by the Local Bond Law.

Health & Welfare, Councilwoman Kathleen Ronan: Councilwoman Ronan reported on complaint of skunks and possums on Dewey Avenue. In closing, Councilwoman Ronan approved all bills, salaries, and wages for her department.

Public Property, Councilwoman Tracy Grossman: No report. In closing, Councilwoman Grossman approved all bills, salaries, and wages for her department.

Public Safety, Councilman Thomas Seiss: Councilman Seiss reported that he met with the Police Chief regarding parking issues on North Boulevard. Councilman Seiss will meet with the school administrator and get recommendations. In closing, Councilman Seiss approved all salaries for his department, has no bills.

Public Works, Councilman Jack Preiss: Councilman Preiss reported that "Children at Play" signs were installed near the Bagelsmith. Street sweeping is scheduled for April 18th and 21st. In closing, Councilman Preiss approved all bills, salaries, and wages for his department.

Professionals & Official Reports:

Mayor, Craig S. Dunwell: Mayor Dunwell reported on correspondences received through his office from the DOT. Mayor Dunwell polled Council on whether they should apply for a federal grant again for sidewalks for all around the Borough. Councilman Seiss and Councilman Schwar would like to see numbers first. Mayor Dunwell reported on the invitation from JCP&L's open house. Mayor Dunwell also reported on the following; Outreach Program on April 30th at the Warren County Library, 1:00-3:00pm. Emergency Squad 80th Anniversary Banquet in May at Architects Golf Club. Mayor Dunwell requested the following executive sessions: 45 minutes executive session for personnel DPW, 10 minutes contractual Aqua, 10 minutes contractual Easement, 20 minutes contractual redevelopment & leasing, 15 minutes personnel DPW, 5 minutes contractual Pursel Street water tank, and 15 minutes litigation COAH.

Police Department, Chief James Faulborn: Chief Faulborn provided the March report. Discussion of issues with kids walking to school ensued.

Fire Department, Chief Sean McDyer: Chief McDyer provided the March report.

Chief McDyer expressed his concerns on the new weight limit on the High Street Bridge.

Chief McDyer announced that this Sunday the pork and sauerkraut dinner will be held.

Attorney, Christopher Troxell: Attorney Troxell reported on the recent property acquisition closing; the property development off of 519 on March 29th. Attorney Troxell asked if Council wants to put the land out for bid for farming. Motion made by Councilman Seiss, seconded by Councilwoman Grossman to allow the Attorney to draft a bid notice for the land to be farmed with a minimum bid of \$100. All were in favor.

Engineer, Frank J. Seney: Mr. Seney referred Mayor and Council to the April 12th report summary. Councilman Seiss questioned item #8 on the report not being authorized.

Sewer Engineer, Jim Hill: Mr. Hill referred Mayor and Council to his report.

Projects on hold until budget passed. Mr. Hill reported that they started up the degreaser again, if second round is in good form, they will switch to a permanent basis.

Councilman Schwar discussed the phone system prompts. Mayor Dunwell responded that the phone system is 20 years old. Mayor Dunwell requested an additional 10 minutes executive session for phones.

Code Enforcement, Thomas Fey: Councilman Pettinelli gave report in Mr. Fey's absence. He met with Kevin Duddy for the Lacaruba complaint, a complaint letter should be written. Councilman Pettinelli requested five minutes executive session for personnel Zoning Officer.

Councilwoman Grossman made a motion that the CFO be authorized to pay all salaries and wages approved by the director, Councilman Schwar seconded. Roll call: Ayes; Grossman, Pettinelli, Preiss, Ronan, Schwar, and Seiss. Nays: none.
