

Mayor Dunwell called the Meeting of the Common Council of the Borough of Alpha to order at 6:30 p.m. on June 14, 2016

Mayor Dunwell announced that adequate notice of the meeting was given and posted on the bulletin board in the Clerk's office satisfying the requirements of the Open Public Meeting Act:

Also said notice has been mailed to persons requesting the same.

Mayor Dunwell led prayer and the salute to the flag.

Roll Call: Present; Councilwoman Grossman (*came in at 9:30 p.m.*), Councilman Pettinelli, Councilman Preiss, Councilwoman Ronan (*came in at 7:00 p.m.*) Councilman Schwar and Councilman Seiss.

Executive Session

Motion was made by Councilman Schwar to go into executive session for 30 minutes to discuss contractual discussions with Aqua NJ, seconded by Councilman Pettinelli. Roll call: all were in favor.

Motion to return to regular session at 7:13 p.m. made by Councilman Pettinelli, seconded by Councilman Schwar, all were in favor.

Public Comment:

Robert Gash, Stewartsville, requesting permission for the Phillipsburg Colts to use the Larry Marino field. Mayor Dunwell said it may be a potential conflict. Mr. Gash stated they adjusted their schedule with soccer. Mayor Dunwell said he is not comfortable at this time to make a decision without Councilwoman Grossman present and requested that Mr. Gash return to the June 28th meeting.

Mike Savary, Park Avenue, inquired about the mayor getting a town issued cell phone. Mr. Savary asked if anything is being done about the trees, growing out into roads. Mr. Savary asked about the vents being replaced in council's chambers. Mr. Savary asked about old softener going for scrap.

Sean McDyer, Dewey Avenue, stated that there's been a list of street with the trees on roadways that has gotten to be two years old, it's gotten worse. Mr. McDyer inquired about the bridge weight limit being lowered on High Street and asked of the County can put signs up.

Mr. McDyer asked if the houses for sale sign can be taken down since the borough acquired the land (behind car wash on County Route 519).

John Patey (sp), said the 20 ton weight limit sign for bridge is behind another one and people can't see it until you're on the bridge already. Asked about Leigh Fuel, why nothing done yet, stated that it is an eye sore. Mr. Patey asked about roof at John Dolak Field.

Mike Savary, Park Avenue, inquire about Leigh Fuel having a tax sale certificate on it.

WHEREAS, the Mandatory Source Separation and Recycling Act, P.L.1987, c.102, has established a recycling fund from which tonnage grant may be made to municipalities in order to encourage local source separation and recycling programs; and

WHEREAS, it is the intent and the spirit of the Mandatory Source Separation and Recycling Act to use the tonnage grants to develop new municipal recycling programs and to continue and to expand existing programs; and

WHEREAS, the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection has promulgated recycling regulations to implement the Mandatory Source Separation and Recycling Act; and

WHEREAS, the recycling regulations impose on municipalities certain requirements as a condition for applying for tonnage grants, including but not limited to, making and keeping accurate, verifiable records of materials collected and claimed by the municipality; and

WHEREAS, a resolution authorizing this municipality to apply for the **2015 Recycling Tonnage Grant** will memorialize the commitment of this municipality to recycling and to indicate the assent of the Council of the Borough of Alpha to the efforts undertaken by the municipality and the requirements contained in the Recycling Act and recycling regulations; and

WHEREAS, such a resolution should designate the individual authorized to ensure the application is properly completed and timely filed.

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Alpha have determined that certain work to the Borough's sanitary sewer system is needed, including work at First Avenue and Alpha Streets involving force main manhole rehabilitation; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Alpha, through their agent Frey Engineering, LLC, have sought quotations publicly for said work, pursuant to New Jersey law and Borough policy; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Alpha has received the lowest responsible quote from The Durnin Corporation, based on the recommendation of Frey Engineering, LLC.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Alpha, County of Warren, State of New Jersey that the said contract for certain work to the Borough's sanitary sewer system, including work at First Avenue and Alpha Streets involving force main manhole rehabilitation as set forth in the attached June 14, 2016 correspondence from Frey Engineering, LLC, is hereby awarded to The Durnin Corporation of Easton, Pennsylvania, for the quote amount of \$10,750.00 for said work, upon written certification of funds by the Borough CFO.

Motion made by Councilman Schwar to approve and hold Executive Session minutes for January 25, 2016; February 8, 2016; and February 22, 2016, seconded by Councilman Pettinelli, all were in favor.

Department Reports:

Mayor Dunwell requested that department reports be brief due to the amount of executive sessions being called tonight.

Administration, Councilman Peter Pettinelli: Councilman Pettinelli questioned cell phones issued by the Borough and asked if there was something he needed to do.

In closing, Councilman Pettinelli approved all bills, salaries, and wages for his department.

Finance, Councilman Michael Schwar: Councilman Schwar stated the substitute bill list took long. They are trying to get everybody paid and they are hammering away. If there is a question with a bill, email the CFO and copy Councilman Schwar as well. Councilman Schwar had a meeting today for HUD group home.

The League of Municipalities conference is November 15th-17th , and any questions on housing call the Clerk .

In closing, Councilman Schwar approved all bills, salaries, and wages for his department.

Health & Welfare, Councilwoman Kathleen Ronan: Councilwoman Ronan provided the Warren County Health report. Councilwoman Ronan stated she received a mosquito complaint and forwarded it to the Mosquito Commission. Councilwoman reported that the town-wide yard sale and clean up went well.

In closing, Councilwoman Ronan approved all bills, salaries, and wages for her department.

Public Property, Councilwoman Tracy Grossman: Councilman Preiss provided the report in Councilwoman Grossman's absence. Industrial Avenue, two acre lot has been cleared. Getting ready for Phase II, receiving quotes. Received estimate for flood lights at the pavilion and will be getting other estimates. Bathroom faucets will be replaced. 7th Avenue is open and pleased with the work, no longer a dip. Issue with soccer goals at Benke Field. Two soccer goals purchased last September were found over the fence with benches and the goals for the little kids a week ago. When they were thrown over the fence they were damaged. A new baseball team was using the field. They have agreed to conduct themselves differently and will reimburse for the damages. A groundhog was stuck in the mesh that was near the woods. The Borough received a Clean Community grant for 2016. Will get permission to paint bridge by Alpha Sub Shop and get kids involved. Received estimates from two companies that the Municipal Building roof needs to be entirely replaced. Asked Charlie Olah to check on status of garbage cans. Purchase order has been done and price has increased. CFO is working on getting a new purchase order.

In closing, Councilman Preiss approved all bills, salaries, and wages for Councilwoman Grossman's department.

Public Safety, Councilman Thomas Seiss: Councilman Seiss reported an issue with the Office of Emergency Management. Part of the problem is our email system. We need to do something with that. In closing, Councilman Seiss approved all bills, salaries, and wages for his department.

Public Works, Councilman Jack Preiss: Councilman Preiss deferred to professional Jim Hill regarding sewer with their report. Water softener vessel is a 30 year item, not up to current standards. Has no use and is scrap. Councilman Seiss disagrees with the comment.

Engineer, Stephanie Cuthbert began discussions of the water vessel. Moving it and putting it in another facility won't work. Councilman Seiss stated they used it with less output at the other facility. Councilwoman Ronan said there were two different liners mentioned. Mayor Dunwell stated we need a motion to get rid of this vessel.

Motion made by Councilman Schwar to authorize Director of Public Works to dispose of the old water vessel, donate the metal to the Cub Scouts, seconded by Councilman Preiss. Roll call: Ayes; Pettinelli, Preiss, Ronan, and Schwar. Nays; Seiss.

In closing, Councilman Preiss approved all bills, salaries, and wages for his department.

Professionals & Official Reports:

Mayor, Craig S. Dunwell: Mayor Dunwell requested the following items for Executive session: 10 minutes contractual for water billing; 25 minutes potential litigation for Phillipsburg sewer rates; 20 minutes contractual for open space; five minutes personnel Attorney; five minutes personnel vacation sick leave; 10 minutes personnel Code Enforcement Officer; 15 minutes contractual Aqua; two minutes personnel to discuss governing body; five minutes personnel contractual CFO training; 10 minutes personnel summer DPW employee; and 10 minutes personnel water main break. Mayor Dunwell stated Tim Mellert of the Land Use Board has resigned.

Motion to accept resignation of Tim Mellert made by Councilman Schwar, seconded by Councilman Preiss, all were in favor.

Police Department, Chief James Faulborn: Chief Faulborn provided the May report as follows: five crashes; two domestic violence; one warrant; and 15 misdemeanors. Mayor Dunwell apologized to Chief Faulborn for his son pushing the panic button.

Fire Department, Chief Sean McDyer: Chief McDyer provided report for the month of May, there were a total of 14 calls. Firehouse will be doing their annual coin toss during the town-wide yard sale.

Emergency Squad, John Dagan: There were 11 calls in the month of May.

Engineer, Stephanie Cuthbert: Ms. Cuthbert provided an update on road projects. 7th Avenue base paved, cleaning up behind cubs. Three roads; First Avenue, Olive Street, and 6th Avenue, plans being developed. Will be presented at next meeting. Utility project, Frace Street treatment plant, piping valve platform is online, resolved ph control issues, and requested schedule from contractor. Redundancy project is next. Tanks are filled with Alpha well water for now. Temporary lower tanks flush it out faster. Hydrants need to be flushed and will speak with Charlie Olah on this.

Sewer Engineer, Jim Hill: Mr. Hill reported on the ongoing sewer projects. The meter pit is working and needs to set up a meeting with Phillipsburg before bidding out. Next couple of weeks the force main manhole will be worked on. The bid package has been looked at, is ready to go. Mr. Hill requested a resolution tonight to go out to bid for grouting and point repairs. Pump station maintenance has been done. Battery charger seems to not be working very well. Replacement is \$500-\$700. Waiting for quotes from pumping services for check valves. Odor control so far so good, haven't had anyone call us.

Library Board, Louis Cartabona: Mr. Cartabona recommended anyone to see the library website for information such as posted calendars and events in the Library. The following is scheduled: Friday June 17th at 6:00 pm, Eyes of the Wild; live animal show featuring rabbits, pythons, snakes, alligators. Movie night June 27th Zootopia. The EBooks system has been updated.

Second Public Comment:

Mike Savary, Park Avenue, stated that he was disappointed about Councilman Seiss not receiving a resolution in time before the meeting. Mr. Savary commented on the vessel.

Payment of Bills & Claims:

Councilman Schwar made a motion to make the Director's reports a part of the minutes. Councilman Pettinelli seconded the motion, all were in favor.

Councilman Schwar made a motion that the CFO be authorized to pay all bills authorized by the Directors, motion seconded by Councilman Seiss. Roll call: Ayes; Preiss, Ronan, Schwar, and Seiss. Nays: none. Pettinelli abstains.
